Open "Doors" of Lockdown June 2020

14 weeks and counting...

Greetings from the Foulkes Five in Cardiff! For the past 3 months, social-distancing measures have been in place. Wales is slowly easing restrictions, but we are not yet allowed to meet in groups. Even though we've been socially distanced, we have found that these past 3 months have opened "doors" to ministry opportunities.

Friends group moves online...

Prior to the pandemic, a group of international women and their toddlers would come together each Wednesday morning to make friends while practicing English. Early on in lockdown, we moved our meeting online using a Bible story with pictures.

Several ladies have joined these online lessons, some of whom do not show us their faces. Without the visual facial cues or gestures, the ladies have had to work hard at using their English and we can see improvement. What's even more exciting is the way that the "M" ladies have been interacting with the Bible stories. Join us in thanking God for this open "door" of opportunity.

Sewing for the community...

At the beginning of lockdown, a local healthcare worker asked if the International Women's Sewing Group could make reusable masks. This launched the sewing helpers into a busy couple of months sewing masks, caps and uniform laundry bags for local healthcare workers. We are thankful for the opportunity to serve the healthcare workers in Cardiff.

Since social distancing is not really feasible in our Monday sewing classes, we hope to launch an online sewing time in July for the ladies from these classes. Once social distancing measures ease further, we hope to have a picnic together in a city park. Please pray that we can reconnect with the 30+ ladies who have attended the sewing class in this past year whether that be online or socially distanced.


The fivesome working from home...

Over these past 3 months, we five are so thankful for God's provisions including health and the ability to work from home. Simon has continued in his role as church manager and our girls have studied through electronic assignments.

On Monday (June 29th), schools in Wales will re-open for 3 weeks adhering to the 2 metre socialdistancing measures. This means that students will attend school on a part-time basis with 10 per classroom. Miriam will go to her school only on Friday mornings; Lydia will attend her school for one week (July 6-10); and Hannah's year will wait to return until September. Please continue to pray that God will direct our girls towards the profession of His choosing in these final years of their secondary schooling.

LunchBowl Network – Trustees report.

This year £272,980 has been donated, last year £188,061 was donated, therefore with an increase of over £84,900. We are very thankful for all funds received.

Nutritional impact: This year we have impacted the nutrition of many children within the Kibera community. Without these donations these children, who are amongst the most disadvantaged in the Kibera, would suffer severe malnutrition. 17,500 hot dinners provided on Saturdays. The Saturday Dinner Programme has operated for 50 weeks of the year for on average 350 children each week. 51,000 breakfasts, lunches and fruit snacks have been provided in the two schools. 381 severely underprivileged children have been educated between two kindergartens and one primary school. 10,920 hot dinners have been provided for 350 children aged between five and nineteen years old attending the Sunday Kings Rugby Development Academy. The charity has facilitated these children being transported from Kibera every Sunday to an international school playing field to learn rugby skills and discipline, receive spiritual input and are given a healthy lunch. 2,396 food packs have been given to 63 families in emergency financial crisis. This has impacted the nutrition of 11,980 children. This is an increase of 33 families from the previous year.

These food packs include maize flour, rice, vegetables, milk, lentils, porridge, oil, charcoal and soap. The families benefiting from the food packs are all connected to Angel Kindergartens and Good Samaritan Primary School.

In total 91,686 dinners have been provided which equates to 7,640 dinners each month.

Educational impact: Early Years education for 196 two to six year olds has been provided at two International Angel Kindergartens. Both kindergartens provide a daily sanctuary, education and food for some of the most vulnerable and youngest children from Kibera. In January 2019 the charity entered into a long term lease with the Anglican Church of Kenya to operate the Good Samaritan Primary School in Karen, Nairobi. The Primary School educates 185 children from Grade 1 to Grade 8 (14 years) in accord with the Ministry of Education. The children are transported daily from Kibera in two buses funded by The Brothers Trust.

Annual Child protection and Safeguarding training has been provided for all Lunchbowl Kenya staff, including Individual counselling given for abused children.
