

Testimony from Ruth Cuthbert

Something happened to me a few weeks ago and thought I'd share it for our Hampreston newsletter.

One evening last week over dinner, we were discussing the differences between Jehovah Witnesses and Christians- conversation starter by Scott! We had a long discussion and found out there are some aspects that we can relate to and some we really can't agree with, such as the Trinity, for example; I'd always tried to focus on what they disagreed with but coming out of that conversation left me with a sense that we need to build bridges with them somehow.

After the morning online service I walked with Amelie, my student, from Wimborne to Canford school by the river, and as we turned in the field to head back, I was struck by a well presented lady in her 70s sitting alone on a bench. I turned to her and asked her how she was doing? Great weather today, etc. She then went on to tell me how it had been so hard for her during lockdown being separated from her family and caused her mental health issues, etc. She explained she was a Jehovah's Witness and had support from her community and I said I was a Christian and go to Hampreston Church. She then said , We both have a hope don't we?'. I was amazed that God was helping me focus on the unity aspect even though everything inside me would normally try to find a hundred reasons why JW's are misled. Instead, I asked her name and if I could pray for her. She was amazed and said she felt like crying. I simply stood there thanked God for leading me to her by His Holy Spirit and prayed for God's peace to fill her..in the name of Jesus...!

We may never know why we have these assignments but God had prepared my heart in advance! I am always amazed that if we step out and take a risk He will do the rest!..
