There can be no doubt that this will be a very different Christmas. Even with the relaxing of Lockdown regulations, many of our usual customs and festivities will not be available to us. For some, the shadow of loss and sickness and financial concern will loom large over the end of the year. From a church perspective, we won't be able to throw our

doors open and welcome the throngs to join us in wondering at the mystery of God made flesh, and adoring Him. Our Christmas Day lunch at St Mary's can't go ahead, the decorations and candles will remain largely boxed up. And yet...

The magnitude of the gift of God in Christ Jesus is such that it cannot be overlooked. It cannot go unmarked. 

The Benefice Christmas Appeal



This year our Christmas Appeal will be for The Lunchbowl Network, Nairobi

AND

the Salisbury Women's Refuge

The Lunchbowl Network was set up in 2006 in response to the plight of the orphaned and vulnerable children living in Kibera, Nairobi. Since then they have provided funding for a weekly Saturday Dinner Programme for 350 orphaned and vulnerable children and provide

creative learning for nearly 400 children in two kindergartens and a primary school. These children endure the harsh reality of life in Kibera including lack of access to clean water, very poor sanitation compounded by an inadequate education that causes them to be severely disadvantaged. The children in the programme have been selected because of their extreme vulnerability and high need. They rely upon the nutrition that is provided daily by The Lunchbowl Network.

Every year The Lunchbowl Network provides over 90,000 dinners which means that every month 7, 640 dinners are provided to the most disadvantaged children from Kibera.

Salisbury Women's Refuge provides accommodation and support for up to 11 women and their children. They work tirelessly to fulfil their mission to provide a safe haven for women and children who experience domestic abuse and support them in leading an independent life.

The service that they provide includes secure accommodation, a tailored support package, advice and signposting for

agencies, safety planning, counselling, domestic abuse awareness, empowerment and self-esteem support work, and highest level of safeguarding. Salisbury Women's Refuge provides accommodation for women and children fleeing domestic abuse including honour-based violence, female genital mutilation and forced marriage.

As an independent charity, they rely on the support of the local community to help them to carry out the vital work that they do.

Facing 2021 with Courage

Greetings to you in the name of our precious soon coming King Jesus Christ. I trust that this finds you well, and managing the events and uncertainties of this most extraordinary year. Like you, I am pleased that there is some hope and expectation of a vaccine rollout very soon, but through everything that has happened, we're reminded too of God's goodness and faithfulness. I would like to encourage you to face the coming year with courage despite the challenges you are going through. My encouragement is from Joshua 1:1-9:-

After the death of Moses the servant of the Lord, the Lord said to Joshua, son of Nun Moses' aide: "Moses my servant is dead. Now then, you and all these people, get ready to cross the Jordan River into the land I am about to give to them - to the Israelites. I will give you every place where you set your foot, as I promised Moses. Your territory will extend from the desert to Lebanon, and from the great river, the Euphrates - all the Hittite country - to the Mediterranean Sea in the west. No one will be able to stand against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you. Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their ancestors to give them. "Be strong and very courageous. Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go. Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful. Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

In this passage, I want to share with you four ways in which you can face 2021 with courage.

1) Courage rests upon a clear assignment from God (v 1-4).

There is no such thing as courage apart from mission, just as there is no such thing as faith apart from challenge. You're not just courageous to be courageous, but you are courageous for something. As for Moses, a man of God, had died; but nothing of God died. He gave Joshua the assignment. He reiterated to Joshua what he had told Moses to do. God isn't needy of worthy men. He makes men worthy. Therefore, we shouldn't fear the loss of any of his human instruments. God isn't fearful of his cause failing.

Ephesians 2:10 implies that we should step out in bold obedience. The good works he has prepared beforehand - we should walk in them! What are the things God has prepared for you to do? When did you last reassess God's call on your life? What are those things that God has given you a passion for? Your courage will rise when you have confidence in the call.

2) Courage rests upon the assurance of God's presence (v 5, 9).

God never calls us to do anything apart from Him. Every assignment that God gives is also his primary means of sanctifying us. The very thing that God is using to draw us to himself is his calling upon us. His calling is a statement of his presence. God's assignments come with a special sense of God's presence, also known as the anointing; and his presence is real. God is saying to you **"As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake** you."

If God has called you, He is with you and will be with you. Courage doesn't mean that you will not be afraid. It means that you fear God more than you fear your environment. It means that you trust more in God's divine resources more than the resources of man. Let your courage rests upon the assurance of God's presence in 2021.

3) Courage rests upon focused determination (v 6, 7, 9). Three times God repeats "be strong and courageous." God does not have a speech impediment. When he repeats himself, he intends to. It also means that what he is saying is so important and you are to pay attention "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

The Lord wants you to be obedient to voice and leading in 2021. What is God calling you to do? Your ability to endure deepens your resolve. If you act courageously, you'll get more courage. God is with you, but He'll only strengthen you when you raise your leg and put it forward. How focused determined are you to that which God is calling you? How ready are you to embrace change from what you are used to? Are you willing to obey God?

(4) Courage is anchored by the word of God (v 7-8).

"Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful." As you look forward to 2021, It is my prayer that you courage will be anchored on the Word of God. That you will love and cherish the Word of God. And that you will allow God's word be food to your soul, medicine to your body and a guide into the way you ought to live. May you proclaim it, meditate on it day and night and do all that is written in it. I wish you a Merry Christmas and a blessed 2021.

'I will never leave you or forsake you' Hebrews 13 v 5

Jim and I were married on the 4th November 1961, it is amazing to us that we have just celebrated our 60th year as a married couple. We want to testify to the unending love and guidance of our Heavenly Father, who during that time has led us on an amazing journey. In following our Father's leading some people thought we were crazy but ignoring God's Word wasn't an option.

Over a period of about ten years God had led us into Baptism (full immersion) and baptism of the Holy Spirit. We both felt that something different was afoot, and when Jim told me that during his preaching God had told him that his work was finished in our church. My instant retort was "Well, He hasn't told me". It was also clear that we were to make a new start in Cornwall! This put me into quite a dilemma. During a church meeting two weeks later the Lord distinctly said to me "What are you doing here?" That was very clear, but I was still afraid of the move to Cornwall from where I had lived all my life. I prayed long and hard and a short time later I was awake and praying and went downstairs and picked up a little Bible from the shelf. Opening it at random, a sentence from Psalm 71 v 16 jumped out at me "I will go in the strength of the Lord!" Between 1972 and 1982 we had adopted three children (a testimony in itself) so a motley crew including our children and four grandparents (a total of nine) moved to Cornwall, all living in one house! We were in Cornwall for 14 years, it was not an easy time and if we hadn't had the Lord as the glue in our marriage, it would have failed. However believing that we were in Gods care, strengthened our relationship and taught us what real love can overcome. The Lord led us to the Anglican church and with encouragement from the vicar, Jim was ordained and we served in the Parish of Pendeen – on the coast road between St Ives and Lands End.

We have known God's guidance, in a miraculous way He led us to Dorset where Jim went on the register and we took services in many of the local churches and Jim was used by many of the local funeral directors. We were looking for a spiritual home and once again we were guided to Hampreston where we immediately knew and experienced the love of the fellowship there.

We have been richly blessed (not with worldly goods) but with undying love and grace of our Heavenly father, and the brothers and sisters who are part of our lives. One of my favourite songs, which always encourages me and I sing it very often, I share with you:-

He giveth more grace when the burdens grow greater He sendeth more strength when the labours increase To added affliction He addeth His mercy To multiplied trials His multiplied peace His love has no limit, His grace has no measure His power has no boundary known unto men For out of His infinite riches in Jesus He giveth, and giveth, and giveth again


