#### Dear Church Member

This evening, the joint Standing Committees of St Mary's Ferndown and All Saints Hampreston & Stapehill met to talk about whether we should continue with in-person services during this national lockdown.

The Government provision is that churches are able to meet for communal worship. However, the national church has asked the local church to decide whether they feel that meeting is right in each different context.

We have come to the difficult decision that we should suspend in-person church services for the time being. This decision was not taken lightly but prayerfully, and we have tried to consider all the different factors. Gathering together as church is such a vitally important aspect of our lives as Christians. We all benefit from it, and have missed it greatly when we haven't been able to meet. The Church is the Body of Christ, and it is important that we are connected! That said, we feel that this is the most loving and responsible course of action at this stage of this international crisis.

We want to assure you that the decision was not taken out of fear. We believe that Jesus is Lord – He is Sovereign over all our circumstances – He was not taken by surprise by a new lockdown. As children of God, our hope is in Him, and we look to Him to help us navigate these times with love, faith and courage.

It is also important to note that the church is not closed! As with previous lockdowns, we will continue to serve our church family, reaching out to one another in love, and to serve our communities in whatever way we can. We do believe that there are many opportunities for us to grow in these days. Although we love our times of gathering, we have always said that being a follower of Jesus is about far more than just coming to Church on a Thursday or Sunday. We are called to whole-life discipleship! This is an opportunity for us to put this into practice. What daily habits might we put in place to help us to grow in Christ-likeness, and to stoke the fires of our love for God?
